Campus Sustainability

There are lots of ways to get involved in IRIS' campus sustainability activities, including:



Survey: Every year IRIS conducts a participatory action research (PAR) project about some aspect of campus sustainability. Help the team conduct the survey, analyze the results, draw comparisons, and write the report.

Engagement: Be part of the team that lets students know about IRIS' events and tables the survey. Work to raise awareness within the York community about sustainability issues!
